## **Rabbi's Reflections**

### Rabbi Joshua Gray

### Our Bereishit

Dear Temple Isaiah Family,

I am writing this short message on our family's first night on Long Island. Meghan, Cameron, Lena, and I could not be more excited to immerse ourselves in this beautiful Temple community, as well as the community at large. While it is possible that you have already read a bit about me, I am interested in getting to know *you*. I truly believe in the servant leadership model, and I am here...to be here for you. Let us pray together, sing together, laugh together, and enjoy simchas and tzures as one mishpacha–one family. I plan on reaching out to each member family individually during my first months as your Rabbi. I will work to earn your trust, and to always listen. Every person comes to the Temple as an individual; each having different needs, different experiences, different approaches. It is important for me to meet people where they are, and that is what I strive to do. *Shema Yisrael* is so central to Judaism. "*Listen*, Israel!" I take these words to heart.

Our annual Torah cycle finds us in Bamidbar, the Book of Numbers. As the Israelites prepare to enter the Promised Land, or *eretz z'vat chalav u'devash* (a land flowing with milk and honey), they find themselves overcome with many highs, and also maneuvering their way through challenging times. As a Temple family, we will experience much together in the moments to come, but I know that we will do so with the joy of Judaism at the forefront of our minds and actions. I am already overwhelmed by the warmth and kindness that our family has been shown over the many months leading up to my official start. Thank you to each and every one of you who has been a part of this journey so far. You are all incredible people with remarkable *neshamot.* I only hope to return such gifts to the community, and smile as all of our inner lights combine to create one amazing flame. It is only appropriate that our first official moment together comes in the form of a Havdalah service. The braided candle with many wicks eventually becomes one larger and more dazzling flame. Is this not a beautiful symbol for what a congregation can be when we all work together to create a holy community striving toward its fullest potential?

I believe that creation is an ongoing process and that Torah is alive and filled with *ruach*, with breath. May we continue to create together; to bring to life the energy of joyful, profound and musical prayer. May the buzz of Jewish learning across generations fill our halls. May the togetherness of our sacred community work together to truly repair the world. *Mah norah HaMakom hazeh: How full of awe is this place?!* Let us begin...

## Introducing Rabbi Joshua Gray

### Temple Isaiah's New Rabbi Emphasizes Joyful Judaism

Temple Isaiah is launching a new direction this summer with a modern approach: Joyful Judaism – and the Temple's search committee found the perfect spiritual leader to guide this transition.

"We're very excited to welcome Rabbi Joshua Gray and his family to Long Island to bring music, spirituality and joy to our lives," said Temple President Howie Kanowitz. "Upon receipt of the unanimous approval of the search committee, the Temple board and congregation, Rabbi Josh will serve as both rabbi and cantor. This is his first pulpit, and we hope he'll lead our community for a long, long time."

A recently ordained rabbi, at 36 years of age, he brings to his rabbinate a wealth of life, work, and Jewish service experience that makes him uniquely qualified to speak to the inclusive Jewish spirit of today. His life journey began in the theater. "My beginnings as a professional actor/singer opened my voice and spirit up to endless possibilities that manifest themselves in the way I approach Judaism; musically and full of 'simcha' (joy), acceptance and passion," said Rabbi Josh. "I am also very family-oriented, as I believe that the voices of children and families in a sanctuary create holiness. My amazing wife, Meghan, is my favorite cantorial soloist, with her incredible voice and spirit. Our children, Cameron (8) and Lena (3), keep us engaged with the youngest of congregants."

Prior work experience in Rabbi Josh's background added an additional skill set to his already impressive resumé. "In addition to his warmth and approachability, Rabbi Josh has a BA in Psychology from Penn State and has worked in the field of mental health, which we considered to be a bonus, especially in the stressful times in which we live," said Marge Weiser, co-chair of the search committee. Working with a Reform and a Conservative congregation upstate, he designed and delivered a three-part course on mental health and wellness as seen through a Jewish lens. In a cover letter sent with his resumé Rabbi Josh wrote, "To put it simply, I am a Rabbi who tries to live the spirit of 'Hineini- Here I am!'"

His exuberance for Judaism, scholarship, pastoral care, liturgy, and teaching all ages shines through. "After a time as an independent rabbi providing ritual services, lifecycle events and Jewish education, he is ready to be infused with the soul of a community and become a congregational rabbi.

"Every member of the search committee had the same feeling after our first interview with Rabbi Josh," said member Gary Kamen. "It felt as though it was divine intervention that brought him to us. In Yiddish the word is bashert... which translates in English to 'meant to be'. We are delighted to have found each other."

## **Temple Isaiah Religious School**

### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

It is an honor and a privilege to have been asked to serve as the Principal of the Rabbi Harvey Witman Religious School for a third time, proving the wisdom of the late great New York Yankee and Rabbinic sage (even if he wasn't Jewish or ordained) Yogi Berra, who often commented, "It ain't over until it's over."

Anyone who works as a Jewish professional knows the accuracy and wisdom contained in that saying. This adage is definitely true in Jewish education where teachers and administrators are constantly planning three to six months ahead to ensure that the educational program and special days, trips and holiday projects will be significant, meaningful and age-appropriate.

When I began working at Temple Isaiah in 1980 I quickly solidified my admiration for Harvey Witman's skill as an able and wise teacher and as a superb school administrator. Harvey was always at the creative edge of Religious School programming, mixing informal youth group techniques with formal classroom instruction, many years before such techniques were even on the radar screens of Jewish organizations.

In 1987, in the journal honoring Harvey, the congregation's then Rabbi, and now Rabbi Emeritus Adam Fisher commented, "Harvey Witman is loved and respected and considered a friend by his students, their parents, and the faculty as well. He has created one of the finest religious schools in the New York area, and is himself an important model for all of what it means to be a Jew in our time." More than 35 years later it's still true.

I summed up all that Harvey is and has meant to our Temple the last time I was Principal by quoting the Danny Siegel poem, "And God Braided Eve's Hair." If you always assume The man sitting next to you Is the messiah waiting for some simple human kindness You will soon come to weigh your words and watch your hands. And if he so chooses Not to reveal himself in your time It will not matter.

I am humbled, honored and consider myself privileged to once again follow the path trod by Harvey Witman as the Principal of Temple Isaiah's, now aptly named, Rabbi Harvey Witman Religious School, and I look forward to working with an incredible team of educators to continue the tradition of bringing a high level of Reform Jewish education to the Three Village area.




